


# Ebola Working Group International Teleconference October 16th, 2014

What will we be discussing?

As these sessions will be focused on 'Sharing Solutions' and experiences related to the management and preparation of Ebola amongst international EMS colleagues, the teleconference participants will be expected do the 'speaking'. International guests and organizations will be invited to share their experiences as well.
